Columbia Basin Youth Football (CBYF) and their Junior Program Head Coach Contract

I do hereby contract with the Columbia Basin Youth Football League to abide by all the following:

- 1. The Head Coach must be age 18 or over.
- 2. All assistant coaches are appointed by the head coach of each team.
- 3. The Head Coach is responsible for the actions of the assistant coaches, parents and team players, prior to, during and after each game, practice and league event.
- 4. If a Head Coach or one of his assistants is penalized for unsportsmanlike behavior, the offending coach will be put on probation for the remainder of the season and is subject to further action taken by the CBYF and their Junior Program Board of Directors per the CBYF bylaws that could result in the coach being relieved of all coaching duties.
- 5. A Head Coach or assistant coach can be removed from their duties if the Junior Program of CBYF Board of Directors agrees being the coach's actions are detrimental to the welfare of the Junior Program of CBYF.
- Each Head Coach is required to maintain accurate records of all player rosters, equipment issues, medical release, parent/guardian information such as street address, phone numbers, general comments and emergency information.
- 7. If an injured player cannot get up on his/her own power, emergency medical aid will be summoned.
- 8. Matters of judgment by officials can NOT be heard for protest either by the Junior Program or CBYF. See CBYF bylaws for other grievances related to CBYF matters.
- 9. The bench area is reserved for players, coaches and authorized team personnel only. Sidelines are specifically for medical personnel and chain crews only. The team box is between the 30-yard lines and a minimum of 5 yards from the playing surface.
- 10. Foul and abusive language used by any coach or player will not be tolerated.
- 11. Each eligible player is to meet playing time requirements set forth in CBYF bylaws.
- 12. The head coach is responsible for knowledge of the rules as defined by the National Federation of High Schools, CBYF bylaws, and their Junior Program bylaws.
- 13. All Head coaches will be USA certified.
- 14. The head coach is responsible for proper use of equipment.
- 15. Coaches do not make league policies; however, they are expected to follow all rules and regulations including both CBYF bylaws and their Junior Program bylaws.
- 16. CBYF and their Junior Programs agree to provide a schedule of games.
- 17. Each team will leave the field and their sideline in a clean condition at the conclusion of their game.
- 18. Coaches must submit their names for a background check.
- 19. Coaches are required to notify the Safety Coordinator in all injuries involving concussions, suspected concussions, suspected broken bones, or 911 notifications.

*I hereby agree to abide by the above items and follow the decisions of the Board of Directors. As head coach I agree to uphold the CBYF and their Junior Program bylaws. I will foster among the members of the team, the ideal of good sportsmanship, citizenship, and character and provide a positive example for others. My signature below indicates that I have read, understand, and agree to this contract as well as authorize a criminal background check required by CBYF and their Junior Program to coach youth football.
